This week in...

Acorns and Oaks: It's been a busy week in the Early Years this week. We have continued learning all about hedgehogs and have had a visit from 'Prickles in a Pickle' who showed us a lovely hedgehog that has been rescued called Sue. The children have all made posters, or hand print hedgehogs send to Judy at the sanctuary to say thank you for coming to see us. In our maths learning in Oaks, we have been counting claps, jumps etc and in Acorns we have been busy recognising numerals and counting to 10. Next Monday, we will have a 'Mucky Monsters' session at Courtenay Park after break, please ensure your child has wellies in that day if it is wet.

<u>Chestnuts:</u> Chestnut Superheroes have been amazing this week! We have started creating our own versions of the Gingerbread Man story and we have some lovely, creative ideas that are going to result in some fabulous stories. In Maths, we have been continuing our work on addition and finding number facts to 10. We are now progressing onto comparing equations using comparative language and symbols. The children started their times tables this week and homework will be sent home on a Tuesday, Homework folders are to be brought in on Monday mornings. Please ensure that you work with your child regularly completing their spellings and times tables in different ways to make it fun and enjoyable, have a look in the homework folder for fun ideas and activities.

Sycamores: Sycamores have been really busy this week and are definitely ready for a break! We had great fun sat around a Stone Age fire this week, carving soap (flint knapping) to make a replica Stone Age tool. A huge mess was made, but it was well worth it! In computing, the children explored how to change the colours of the sprites and make them move. They're really making great progress with their algorithms. In English, we identified all the features of instructional text and in Maths we have been pulling apart how to use the column method confidently. We have also introduced a daily 2 minute times table test. In PSHE we have been continuing our work on resilience and how our effort levels are linked to our successes. We are now really clear about what 'Growth Mindset' means and how it can transform our learning!

Redwoods: Redwoods have been grappling with multiplication this week. After working hard on multiplying by 10, 100 and 1,000, this week we've been multiplying 4-digits by 1-digit and then pushed ourselves to look at 2-digits x 2-digits. We've been using partitioning to help us get our heads round this and have also looked at the grid method (ask us about the 'zero hunter goggles'!). In English, we've been looking at using colons correctly and reminding ourselves of the two (and only two) important jobs an apostrophe does. We're starting to write first person narratives set in the Stone Age. Here's an extract from Jacob's work for you to enjoy: Just as I blinked, some extraordinary embers floated like petals in the wind. They left a trail on the ground like ink from a pen. I followed the trail to find an elder sitting next to me by the fire. He had a red-hot spherical stone grasped between two deer ant-lers... Any ideas about what he was doing?
