This week in...

<u>Acorns and Oaks</u>: What a lovely week in the Foundation Stage! We have just started our new book about hedgehogs and hibernation; the children are enjoying role-playing the characters in the book. In our maths learning in Oaks, we have been investigating addition with some of us recording our own additions! Next Tuesday, we have a special visitor coming in to talk to us about hedgehogs from 'Prickles in a Pickle'. Please can your child bring a donation of £1, some Go Cat biscuits, and/or old blankets as a donation for the hedgehogs that are rescued.

<u>Chestnuts</u>: Chestnuts have been incredibly busy this week! They have been immersing themselves completely in The Gingerbread Man to understand the story and characters. In Maths, the class have been working on addition. We have been partitioning numbers between 10 and 20 and working systematically to find all possible addition facts. The children have completed their Rangoli Pattern as part of our school's Diwali day. In addition, the children were really intrigued to find out about the 100 year anniversary of the World War 1 Armistice in 1918. This made their poppy mural very poignant and it looked great in front of the school to commemorate the soldiers that lost their lives.

Sycamores: Another great week in Sycamores. We have continued with our instruction writing in English and the children managed to follow some really tricky instructions to make a pin-wheel poppy. We were able to improve the instructions by including more detail, diagrams and prepositions. In Maths we have looked at bar models. Different ways to add two numbers and wait for it... commutative law. See if the children know what this is! We had great fun building Stonehenge from biscuits and then eating our work. Redwoods: Another cracking week in Redwoods! We are really proud of the amazing learning the children have done. We've been exploring multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 ,1000 and even pushed ourselves to 10,000! We are also exploring the idea of *using what you know to work out what you don't know*! In English, we've been pulling apart a first person narrative, ready to write our own. Flint knapping and investigating the properties of rocks have also been on our busy agenda (check out the pictures on Facebook) ...phew! Ready for a restful weekend now.
