This week in...

Acorns and Oaks: What a lovely week we've had in Acorns and Oaks this week! The children have settled well into school life and are engaging well in all their learning. We have been focussing on our feelings and emotions this week and the children have been able to discuss when they have felt some emotions at times. In our Maths learning, we have been counting and showing numbers in different ways. I have sent home books linked to the children's phonics learning this week, please make sure these are also in school daily, so we can read with the children.

Chestnuts: Chestnuts have been working on representing numbers using different concrete materials. They have been able to explain how other numbers are hidden inside bigger ones. We have talked about how it's tricky to know the difference between the teen numbers and tens numbers. 'Fourteen sounds like forty'. In Literacy, the class have begun looking at their first class story together; 'What to do with vegetable glue'. We have been making predictions about what we think is going to happen in the story using the front cover to support our ideas. Ask them about the book and what they think 'vegetable glue' might be. Our Topic, Science, Art and Literacy are all focusing this term on staying healthy. We tasted and chopped some different fruits and described their flavour and appearance.

Sycamores: Sycamores have had a great week. We are really proud about how hard they are trying to build up their resilience and listening skills. Their cursive handwriting is already improving and they even know some French! In Maths we have investigated different ways to record numbers and used lots of equipment to show this. In English, we have planned our setting description and the children have chosen some really exciting places to write about from tropical paradises to enchanted forests. We've had our first lesson on scratch learning to code a flip book animation and we are very excited to learn more about this. PE has been great fun, playing games in Tri Golf and working with coach Ben. Well done Sycamores, keep up this hard work.

Redwoods: In Redwoods, we've been digging around in The Stone Age. We've been reading a book called 'Stone Age Boy' and wrote informal letters from the character's viewpoint. In Maths, we've strengthened our reasoning and explanation skills and applied this to develop our number sense. With Mrs Fraser's encouragement, we've created our own prehistoric cave full of our cave paintings.
